

In April we remembered the Holy Week story, celebrated Easter, and kicked off the new Sanctuary Project fundraising effort. At first glance it does not seem that the first two are connected to the last one. Holy Week is about remembering

in the words of 1John 3:16, "We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us..." And Easter is about celebrating the ripple that has moved out from Jesus' resurrection and finds its way to us today. A Sanctuary Project, doesn't seem to fit in the category of sacrificial love or Easter's transformation.

Get Connected was chosen as the theme for this second part of the Sanctuary Project campaign in part because it recognizes the importance of worship in connecting us to our God. The history of our Christian faith tells of how this connecting in worship has changed throughout the generations. A tradition of oral recitation worked well for people who did not have access to printed material. The invention of the printing press and the Enlightenment gave people access to their own Bible, shared liturgy, and expository preaching. The advent of electricity changed the design of our churches, allowing light and sound systems to be used. We ourselves have seen an explosion of technology that invites people to visually participate in learning and connecting with others.

The Sanctuary Project seeks to connect people to our God and to one another by using the technology that is no longer a luxury but a part of what is necessary to communicate the gospel's message of God's love in Jesus Christ and the transformative nature of Easter's story

Romans 10:14 says: "But how shall they ask him to save them unless they believe in him? And how can they believe in him if they have never heard about him? And how can they hear about him unless someone tells them? "

 Thank you all for your support of the Sanctuary Project!

To date we have raised **\$141,393.26** and have yet to raise **\$123,606.74** to meet our goal. Thanks for your generosity!

The Sanctuary Project will both replace and enhance the technology (audio, visual, and lighting) used in our Sanctuary. At a price of \$265,000 with a 10% mission pledge some of us feel this is an extravagant use of our resources. But technology has changed and so has the church.

Some of us remember when having 'indoor plumbing' was a luxury that maybe we couldn't afford but we wouldn't think of buying a house that doesn't have that technology today. Some of us can remember when not everybody had electricity. We remember when a radio in our home or a telephone on the wall was a big deal. Maybe we remember our first TV, microwave, personal computer, lap top, cell phone, or tablet. All this is to say that technology has changed dramatically in our life time and things that were extravagant have become ordinary and we couldn't imagine life without them. The technology being addressed in the Sanctuary Project is no longer a luxury but an important tool in communicating our message that we are to love God and love one another.
