FROM THE PASTOR

Ann Weems, poet, Presbyterian, and St Louisian touches on a hope and longing within many of us in her poem The Year Will Be Different:

Who among us does not have dreams that this year will be different? Who among us does not intend to go peacefully, leisurely, carefully toward Bethlehem, for who among us likes to cope with the commercialism of Christmas which lures us to tinsel not only the tree but also our hearts? Who among us intends to get caught up in tearing around and wearing down? Who among us does not long for: gifts that give love? shopping in serenity? cards and presents sent off early? long evenings by the fireside with those we love? (the trimming devoid of any arguing about who's going to hand what where, the aroma of cinnamon and nutmeg mingling with the pine scent of the tree, and carols gently playing over our idyllic scene) and the children! The children cheerfully talking about giving instead of getting: Who among us does not yearn for time for our hearts to ponder the Word of God? moments of kneeling and burst of song? the peace of quiet calm for our spirit's journey?

This year we intend to follow the Star instead of the crowd.

But, of course, we always do intend the best.

(And sometimes best intentions tend to get the best of us!)

This year, when we find ourselves off the path again (and we invariably will!)

let's not add another stress to our Advent days,

that of trying to do Christmas correctly"!

Instead, let's approach the birth of our Lord with joyful abandon!

And this year
let's do what Mary did and rejoice in God,
let's do what Joseph did and listen to our dreams,
let's do what the Wise Men did and go to worship,
let's do what the shepherds did and praise and glorify God for all we've seen and heard!
As for the Advent frantic pace, we don't have time for that.
We'll be too busy singing!
This year will be different.

Maybe these words are just sentimentalism. But maybe they give voice to a deep longing within us that gives birth to something new and something holy as we travel together toward Christmas.





Hello, Presbyterians!

The Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) was elected October 29. The committee met that day at 11:50 in the church library. During the meeting the committee met Martha Wiley who is our representative from the Commission on Ministry (COM). Martha distributed a list of "13 General steps for a pastor search". We learned that we will create an MIF that will be approved by the COM and UPS, then posted on line, then matched with PIF documents. (Look for explanations of



those and many more abbreviations in future updates!) During this meeting, Ed was chosen as convener, Emily as recorder, and Lynn as communicator (which is the reason I am writing this!) It was decided that regular meeting time will be the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month. Meetings will be held to one hour as often as possible!

The second meeting of the PNC was held on Tuesday, November 14 at 7:00, in the church library. There was discussion of the "General steps for a pastor search", including timeline for preparing our MIF, activities that will require travel, and how that is provided for by the session, what information should be confidential and what can be shared. Ed distributed a copy of the results of the Congregation Conversation held in September. The group expects that information to be helpful for discussion and preparing an MIF. The need for references was also discussed, and members were urged to consider possible references. The next meeting will be November 28th.

MISSION NEWS



The November session meeting was held on Wednesday the 15th just a little over a week before Thanksgiving and for devotions Joe McConnell gave a history on the Original Thanksgiving followed by prayer. The reading left all with some food for thought and remembering all we have to be thankful for.

January 2, 2017 we welcomed Rev. William Warhover as our Interim Pastor. Seeing as we are nearing the end of the year, we looked back to where we were a year ago- the work accomplished, and the work left to be done. The Session has come together, working extra hours and getting much accomplished, and thanked Bill for his leadership. It is time to wrap up the old year and look to 2018.

The Session approved a Congregational meeting for December 3, 2017 following the 10:30 service for the purpose of electing officers. Session also approved a new contract for Rev. Warhover as Interim Pastor which will be sent to the Presbytery of East Iowa for their approval.

For 2018: The Session has set the dates for communion and the annual worship/ picnic at Lake Darling (August 26, 2018); the Pastor Nominating Committee will be hard at work (with the guidance of the Holy Spirit) to call a new Pastor for our church; and we look forward to an exciting year for the United Presbyterian Church with our vision of "transforming lives by sharing our experience of God's love and acceptance."

Remember as you make your plans for the Christmas holidays that there will be NO 8:00 morning service on Sunday, Dec. 24. There will be a 10:30 morning service and a 7:00 evening service.


Landscaping Information!
