From the Pastor...

While the winter solstice in December brings us the news of Jesus' birth, "the light shining in the darkness," the beginning of spring brings us the news of Jesus' resurrection, of life coming from deadness.

Spring is filled with resurrection reminders; the crocus creeping slowly out of their winter slumber, the browns and grays of fall giving way to a palate of greens, the birds nesting – keeping watch over their flock by night, and the tadpoles lying in shallow waters doing the work of becoming frogs.

Spring is filled with resurrection reminders. New life coming from the midst of deadness.

Paul has this in mind when he writes to the church in Roman:

Or have you forgotten that when we were joined with Christ Jesus in baptism, we joined him in his death? For we died and were buried with Christ by baptism. And just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glorious power of the Father, now we also may live new lives. (Romans 0:7-4)

On April 22nd we will be baptizing and confirming members of the Confirmation class. When we do this, each of us will be reminded of our baptisms and how that baptism is meant to be transformative - meant to be a resurrection reminder - that even now something new is being born within us.

Beginning April 2, during normal business hours, the only doors that will be unlocked will be the door off the south parking lot (Washington Street side). The north side


and east side doors will be locked.

Washington Against Hunger - May 6th, 3 pm at the KC Hall

There will be food packing for HACAP-which is for the local branch in Washington- and also for Take Away Hunger- which has a branch in Mount Pleasant (used to be in Brighton)-but distributes food throughout the world. This involves the churches in Washington that come together to help those in need.



Take Away Hunger involves measuring and packaging specialized rice based soy casserole into bags that can be easily transported to feed the world. Their mission is to mobilize cities to feed nations.

Since January, they have made 941.520 meals. HACAP has a great need of food in the summer months when children are home from school. HACAPs main branch in Marion-which Washington is a part of- distributes over 6 million pounds of food to individuals annually. Please come and be a part of this fun and important outreach event in our community.

Visiting in the homes of people in our church family who cannot come to join us at the church building, is one of the most meaningful ways the church can show compassion and love! These individuals may be cut off from the church's fellowship due to age, medical condition, or other reasons. It requires no in-depth theological knowledge, no financial cost is involved, and it does not take hours of your time. One may be nervous about visiting that first time, but it is God who has called us to this task, and God will certainly equip us for it.

From the earliest days of its being, the church has been concerned with caring for those within the fellowship of the church with various needs. We can model Jesus' compassion for those folks by going to them in their homes...

Each month, six of our deacons, five volunteers from our congregation, and our pastors call on twenty seven to thirty folks from our church family who are in these situations. We strive to extend the hospitality, joy, and love of Christ to them. We visit folks at Halcyon House(Apartments, Arbor House,

Sagewood, and Wedgewood), the UP Home (Brownlee Health Center, Garret Health Center, Stewart Hall, Sherman Hall, Kerr Hall, Cottages), at the Colonial Manor in Columbus Junction, and in four private homes.

One of our congregational volunteers often says after her monthly visit, "I feel I get so much more from my visit, then I could possibly begin to have given to her." Caring was the hallmark of Jesus' ministry and should be a hallmark of ours!
