Annual Meeting of the Congregation/Corporation

The duly called Annual Meeting of the Congregation/Corporation of the United Presbyterian Church of Washington, IA was held on Sunday, January 27, 2019, in the Fellowship Hall. The meeting was preceded by a cooperative lunch after the 8:30am worship service. A quorum was present.

At 9:30am the meeting was called to order by the Moderator, Rev. Erin Kaye, and she opened the meeting with prayer. Copies of the 2018 Annual Report of the Congregation were handed out to those present. She thanked those in the kitchen and all who brought food to share for the luncheon.

Rev. Erin asked for a motion to approve the minutes from the January 28, 2018 Annual Meeting. The motion carried.

Rev. Erin explained that the Session guaranteed the Youth Director position for Jared Long through December 31, 2019. This decision would put our budget in the red and Rev. Erin challenged the congregation to support our church staff in their donations. In connection with that, the Stewardship campaign did a fantastic job and Rev. Erin thanked the committee, while also reminding the congregation it's their turn to give more if able.

Questions were asked about the Worship Band moving forward once Butch Zwicki was gone in April. It was decided that the band would continue until at least June and then it would be re-evaluated. Erin has been working with the band and the personnel committee to determine if hiring a part-time leader to work with the adult and children's choir, hanbells, etc would be beneficial. It was also discussed that "hoping things work" is not a plan and that ultimately we must wait on the band members to decide if they are staying or leaving after Butch leaves.

Rev. Erin asked everyone to talk to the people at their table by asking their names and then asking, "Where did you see God in the last year"? Conversations were had amongst the tables.

At 9:42am, Rev. Erin closed the meeting with prayer.

A duly called meeting of the congregation of the United Presbyterian church of Washington, IA was held in the Sanctuary of the church following a 10:00 am worship service on December 8, 2019.

The purpose of the meeting was to vote on nominees presented by the nominating committee for officers (elders, deacons and nominating committee members) for 2022. At 11:03 am Pastor Kaye opened the congregational meeting with the prayer from the worship service serving as the opening prayer. She noted that a quorum was present. Julie Johnson was elected as clerk for the meeting.

Report from the Secretary & Treasurer

This has been quite the year for transitions for us all and it will only continue in 2020. I hope everyone knows just how grateful I am for the patience and kindness that has been shown to me and my family this last year. There have been many words of encouragement sent my way, as well as offers of help with anything needed, and I am so thankful for all of you. It was not an easy decision to move and we will miss you all.

I would like to especially thank the volunteers that have put in countless hours behind the scenes-not just in the office-but in the entire church. You are exactly what this church needs to run smoothly and efficiently! I know that my job would be much harder without all of your help-so THANK YOU!

Financially, 2019 had some ups and downs. We came into the year with a deficit in order to keep staff on full time. Our income in budgeted categories was \$282,921 (92.8% of budget), while our budgeted expenses were \$317,775 (100.4% of budget). Our overall expenses exceeded our income which means we had to use \$20,000 from our Perpetual Endowment fund to balance the budget. A positive note to mention is that we had only budgeted \$170,000 for pledges and you all exceeded that for the year, coming in at \$195,000. Our unpledged receipts fell around \$20,000 short of projected income.

Thank you for a wonderful (almost) 3 years here at United Presbyterian Church.

Christian Education

The Christian Education Team has had another a year of working hard to put on a variety of programs and events for the children, youth, and adults of our community. We have continued to do these programs in a way that allows all involved to experience God's love.

The year continued with the kids in Son City learning about God and exploring how He shows up in our everyday life. These trips were fun and exciting for the kids to keep learning about God and Christian life in their everyday lives. In the fall, Son City went back to a rotational-based learning program, but this time all of the kids are in one group. This has been great for all as the "big" kids get to help the "little" kids in different units and they all get to learn about God in their own way.

The Christian Education Team continued to assist with various programs this last year including Adult Sunday School, youth groups, camps, adult study groups, our family movie nights in the sanctuary, Vacation Bible School and the ice cream social and pool party. Sunday School continues to be provided for those in the Nursery, Preschool/Kindergarten, Son City, Middle School, High School, and adult classes. The CE Team is grateful for the leaders of the various adult groups that meet throughout the year, as they provide additional avenues for our adults to expand their Christian knowledge.

Youth groups continued for both Crew and Inside Out during the school years as well as some gatherings over the summer. Those groups spent time learning about God's love for them and how we should care for others around us. During the year they shopped for food to fill HACAP boxes, played games (old and new) and ate a few snacks. Opportunities such as Camp Wyoming, Inside Out Mission Trip, Friday Crew, and Vacation Bible School provided additional opportunities for youth to experience and share God's love during the summer months. This fall saw the return of our after school Jam Kids program. This has been met with much excitement and all involved are excited about the opportunities this program has to serve our elementary aged kids within our church congregation and how it reaches out to others within our community.

The CE Team is grateful for all of those who have been involved in the programs our church has offered this past year. Whether you are up front in all the action or behind the scenes making cookies or setting up different activities, you are there to help put on our numerous programs and we are forever grateful for your assistance. Finally, the CE Team looks forward to the new leadership the Lord has blessed us with as we transition from having Jared in full time capacity to our part time positions. We will continue to look for ways to help all in our church family continue to grow in their faith.

The committee also is completing the evaluations of the staff and continues to give support and ideas for the personnel issues in our church.

Deacons

The Board of Deacons of the Washington United Presbyterian Church have been striving to carry out our ordination vows of "sharing the love and justice of our Lord Jesus to all, by showing concern and extending help to the friendless and to all those in need". The Board of Deacons consists of six deacons and one youth deacon. Each deacon is the coordinator of one of our ministries and is assisted by volunteers from the congregation who have a particular passion for that area of service. Ministries coordinated by the deacons are:

- 1. Communion: Extending the Table Services at the U.P. Home Health Center and Halcyon House for communion are held monthly. A total of 194 people were served communion in 2019. The deacons assumed the responsibility of scheduling dates for the services, as well as the leading of and the serving of communion the last two years while we had interim pastors. We are so very grateful to have Pastor Erin assisting us now. The residents are so delighted to have the opportunity to get acquainted with Erin. We thank musicians Julia Gamon, John Thorne, and Eva Gallagher, who have provided accompaniment on the piano for singing at each service.
- **2. Monthly Visitation Ministry**: As a means of extending the hospitality and love of Christ to our church members who have difficulty or are unable to leave their homes, they are called on monthly by a deacon or a deacon visitation volunteer. We average around twenty-three calls per month. Pastor Erin makes occasional visits as well as the hospital calls. Deacons Kathy Knutson and Mary Atwood coordinate this ministry.
- **3. Transportation Ministry**: Providing rides for folks who are in need of transportation to worship and church activities, local doctor and therapy appointments, and rides for treatments in Iowa City are ways our transportation ministry shares love and compassion for all of God's children. Thanks to Larry Barlett, our volunteer coordinator, and to all the volunteers who have faithfully assisted him.

- **4.Card Ministry**: Twenty-six 90 + birthday cards, 27 get well cards, 20 sympathy cards, 3 congratulations cards, and 25 thinking of you cards have been sent this year by deacon volunteer Joyce Wilson. This is a total of 101 notes of love and caring sent in the year of 2019.
- **5. Email Prayer Chain Ministry**: Members of our church family who have prayer concerns may ask for prayers from those in our church family who have signed up to be part of our prayer chain ministry. All requests must be approved by the individual person asking for prayers. We had 96 prayer requests in 2019. Currently 100+ households regularly receive this mailing. We are so thankful to have so many in our church family committed to praying for each other`s needs. Mary Atwood was the prayer chain coordinator with Lynn Loula assuming that responsibility in September.
- **6. Meals on Wheels Delivery Ministry**: Our church is responsible for helping with the delivery of hot meals for eight weeks yearly. The YMCA coordinates the list of individuals who have requested meals, the local hospital prepares the meals, and nine local churches alternate in the delivery of the meals. Meals are delivered with smiles on our faces as we also do a welfare check on each recipient. We were pleased to see an increase this year in the number of meals requested daily. Thanks to the faithful volunteers from the congregation who assist with this ministry. Kathy Hunt is our Deacon Meals Coordinator.
- 7. "Reach Out and Touch" Poster Ministry: These posters provide an opportunity for our congregation to sign and to share of their love, joy, and concern. Eleven care posters were created, made, and delivered by deacon volunteer Jane Cuddeback in 2019.
- **8. Easter Flower Sharing Ministry**: Easter flowers, that had decorated our sanctuary, were delivered with the Love and Joy of our Risen Christ after Easter morning worship. Marde McConnell was our Easter Flower Coordinator.
- **9. Camp Reece Relief Volunteers Ministry**: We are responsible for providing volunteers and cookies for one evening at Camp Reece, which provides a spiritual based camping experience for special needs people. Kathy Knutson and Sarah Robison were our Camp Reece Coordinators.

The 2019 Board of Deacons were Kathy Hunt, Terry Mangold, Mary Atwood, Marde McConnell, Kathy Knutson, Sarah Robison, and Gabby Anderson. We are so grateful for the number of selfless volunteers from the congregation that assist us in this ministry. Larry Barlett and Syndey Cuddeback will be installed as new deacons on our board for 2020, as well as Terry Mangold returning to serve a one year term. Our heartfelt thanks extends to Kathy Hunt who has completed six years of service. We ask that each of you join us in praying that LOVE AND JUSTICE FLOWS TO ALL OF GOD`S CHILDREN!

Kingdom Kids Preschool

Kingdom Kids Preschool (KKP) is in its fifteenth year of operation. Teachers, Brenda Miles and Jennifer Holthus are certified in First Aid, CPR, Mandatory Reporting of Child Abuse, and Universal Precautions. Miles holds an Iowa State Teaching License. Staff have participated in ongoing trainings provided by Grant Wood AEA and 4Cs as well as online trainings provided by Iowa State Extension.

KKP is one of the community preschools participating in the Iowa Voluntary 4- Year Old Preschool Program. This state funding offers tuition free preschool to all 4-year olds. We have also added one 3 year old to this class due to low numbers and the family pays tuition of \$100 per month.

Our Pentecost offering has paid for a child's supply fee and some transportation.

KKP ended the 2018-19 school year with 15 four year olds. For the 2019-20 school year we began with 7 four year olds and 1 three year old. Currently we serve 8 four year olds and 1 three year old. This class meets on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 8:15 to 11:15. In order to comply with State requirements, we are using Creative Curriculum for 2 ½ hours each morning and supplement that with up to 30 minutes of faith-based activities like songs, stories, or an opening prayer as a mission of this church. Pastor Erin has been meeting with us on Mondays to share Jesus' love. Along with learning to share, taking turns, and working as a classroom community, all children are exposed to appropriate pre-academic skills.

Kingdom Kids Preschool continues to struggle with enrollment due to the perks that the school district can offer preschool families. Therefore, there is currently some question as to what role this preschool will take on in the coming years. Please pray that our decisions will be guided by God.

The current Board of Directors for KKP consists of Karen Trotman (chair), Katie Lujan, Brad Alderton, Brandon Bishop, Carrie Septer, Tera Pickens, Emily Piette, and Meagen Wagner.

Missions

The Mission Committee has been busy working on many projects.

- The offering for Sunday School year Sept 2018-August 2019 was for HACAP. We packed 208 boxes that were sent to HACAP.
- For Christmas last year we were able to sell ornaments with the profits going to PDA. We raised over \$600. We had several people ring bells for the Salvation Army, 10 families/Sunday School classes participated in the HACAP adopt a family program, and we were able to donate over 170 mitten, scarves and hats to the local schools.

- Volunteers from the church participated in "Night to Shine" a prom for special needs.
- We collected 56 books and over 750 diapers and wipes for Family Connection- a group that works with new parents teaching them how to care for their children.
- The mission Brochure was completed and also magnets were given to members of the church, so that we can all pray for the missionaries that we support.
- Each member of the committee is corresponding to a missionary that our church supports and will their correspondence on the Mission bulletin board. We are working to increase the communication between our church and our missionaries.
- We were able to meet with Darren Brown who is in charge of the local homeless shelter (Lighthouse). We donated money to them from the sanctuary project mission money for their mission to bring Jesus to the homeless in Washington.
- We've been working on setting up volunteer opportunities for members of the church in Washington and in the surrounding communities.

Presbyterian Women

The Presbyterian Women (PW) has one bible study circle. They meet on the second Wednesday of each month from September to June. The study this year is "Love Carved in Stone", a study of the Ten Commandments.

The Spring Salad Luncheon was held in May. The program was about Human Trafficking, given by a Washington Police Officer. It was a great day and there were about a dozen ladies from nearby churches.

The Fall Dessert was held on September 18, 2019. Reverend Kitch Shatzer reported on all of her PW adventures she had attended during the summer. They included a Mission Trip to Indian County in North Dakota.

The Thank Offering Service was held on November 24, 2019. Reverend Kitch Shatzer led the service and many women took part in the service.

Kitch and Betty attended the PW Presbytery gathering in the Spring and Fall. Kitch also attended the Synod PW Gathering in the summer.

PW takes up an extra offering each month for several local missions including: Operation Back Pack, Pure Water for All, Rick Fulton's Mission Mobility, Enrichment Foundation and Menal. PW has contributed time and effort for our congregation, including serving funeral luncheons and coffee hour, and supporting the sewing committee. This year they have made the following:

Saturday Kitchen

<u>GOAL</u>: The goal is to provide a meal for those who are hungry. This is a free, Saturday meal available to anyone in the Washington area. We begin serving at 11:30, with seconds and take homes offered. In addition to the meal, it's also a time of fellowship, with people coming as early as 9:00 just to drink coffee and visit.

<u>WHO COMES</u>: Some of those attending are individuals on a fixed income and individuals with disabilities who come with a service provider. Some are families who appreciate a free meal in a pleasant atmosphere and others come because they are lonely and look forward to a time to visit with friends.

<u>LOCATION:</u> Our church is the location for the meals because: it's visible from the highway it's handicapped accessible, and has a great kitchen. Each Saturday a large sign is placed along E. Washington St. reminding community members that we're "open." The Saturday Kitchen takes place <u>every</u> Saturday, 52 times each year, as many of our guests need this food and time of fellowship.

<u>HOST GROUPS</u>: In 2020 there will be 7 churches participating on a flexible schedule: Assembly of God Church and Tues. a.m. Optimists together (4); the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (4); First Baptist (4), Immanuel Lutheran (4), St. James Catholic (5), Washington Mennonite (4) and our U.P. Church (7) which includes church family (4), Pathfinders Class (2) and U.P. Youth and Fareway (1).

Additional Host Groups who request specific dates are: HACAP Board (2), Halcyon House (1), three local PEO chapters, J, MX, and OC together (2), Prairie Pride and Go Getters 4-H Clubs together (1), Reformed Presbyterian Church (1), Salem Church of God and Washington County Cattlemen's Association together (1), United Presbyterian Home (1), Washington County 4-H County Council (1), Washington County Hospital and Clinics (2), Washington County Pork Producers (1), Washington Education Association (1), WCDC Board (1), WHS National Honor Society students and Fareway (1).

We have a total of 26 host groups! Each host group has two coordinators and provides and prepares the food for their meal while responsible for their own set-up and cleanup. Each host group has two coordinators. They borrow and return a church key and complete a short summary sheet each time they host. The summary sheet is emailed the following week to the other host coordinators.

<u>HOST RESPONSIBILITIES:</u> Food is prepared for about 120 people, with about eighty to ninety people usually eating the meal. This number can vary, dependent on the weather or other circumstances. Guests are welcome to have seconds. At 12:15 attendees may have "take outs" of left-over food. All left-over food or drink is given away to our guests.

<u>DONATIONS FOR SATURDAY KITCHEN GUESTS:</u> In the summer there is often free garden produce, some generously donated by church members, the Aldertons. Occasionally, there are other donated items from our church family and/or other community members, such as: books, bread, potatoes, other food items, paper products and hygiene items.

<u>SATURDAY KITCHEN PUBLICITY:</u> Each winter we publicize the Saturday Kitchen with posters around town and we ask KCII to publicize it. The Chamber has it in their newsletter. Goodwill also willingly places flyers in their customers' sacks for a week and HACAP includes flyers in their food boxes. All agencies providing services to those with disabilities are given flyers reminding them of the Saturday Kitchen. Also, all Saturday Kitchen guests are given flyers and are asked to share them with their friends. Lastly, we give them to the schools to place in the backpacks for the kids who are part of the Backpack Program.

We will be reaching out to the coordinators of the Lighthouse Center, Washington's new homeless shelter, to make our free, Saturday, meal option known to those staying at the shelter.

<u>COOORDINATORS' GATHERING:</u> There was a November, evening gathering of all the coordinators able to attend. Previous years we have had noon meetings so this year we had an evening meeting to try to accommodate those working out of town.

We mutually shared information about our experiences, learning from each other and helping new hosts learn how "it works." It was also a time for Joe and me to learn how we can help the host groups have an even more positive experience.

<u>UP CHURCH UPDATE:</u> THANK YOU TO OUR UP CHURCH FAMILY!! We have a wonderful group of volunteers from younger kids to older adults who have fun together as we work "our Saturday." We've even had entire families volunteer to help. You're never too young or too old to be a part of this ministry. You can participate as your schedule or energy level allows!

Volunteers bring desserts, set tables, prepare and serve food, greet our guests, and help clean-up. Occasionally we've even had some piano playing entertainment.

We can always use more help, so if you feel called to this Christian outreach to those who are hungry and/or lonely in our community, please call us. We'd love to have you join us, whether regularly or just occasionally. Together we're reaching out in God's love in this very important ministry of sharing food and providing an opportunity of fellowship to "our neighbors."

<u>UP CHURCH THANK YOU:</u> All the participating hosts AND our Saturday Kitchen guests are very grateful to our UP Church family for sharing its facility for the Saturday Kitchen meal. They're also very grateful for our church's commitment to serve as the host location each and every Saturday, all year long.

Here's what we do each Sunday, unless there's a special event:

- <u>Refreshments</u>: Initially only the team provided refreshments and now our church family helps (fruits and pastry items). We've been very pleased with everyone's willingness to help out and bring items.
- <u>Coffee Cart and other Drink Items:</u> We stock and prepare the coffee cart and the other drink items.
