

Friends,

What a year! We have bid goodbye to staff, welcomed new staff, worshiped together, prayed together, learned together, and played together. We have laughed and cried together. Thank you to everyone who purchased ornaments. The money raised went to help the Lighthouse (homeless shelter in Washington). Thank you also to those who brought mittens, hats, and scarves to help the children in our community who don't have anything to keep them warm. Also thank you to those who rang bells at Fareway. The money that we helped raise goes to the Ministerial Society to assist those in need.

The Mission Committee met with Darren Brown who runs the homeless shelter (now called the Lighthouse) here in Washington. Darren has a passion for helping spread God's love to those who are homeless. They have 20 beds but have housed many more than that. They started thinking they needed beds for homeless men but immediately had to figure out where to house families that were homeless. Darren shows these people God's love along with helping them figure out what they need to do to become self-sufficient. He is working on a plan to open up a second hand store to help with the operating costs for

the shelter. Our church used some of the money given as the mission part of the sanctuary project to help Darren in his mission to spread God's love.

As the year ends our Welcome Team would like to thank everyone in our church family for your support this past year.


We've asked for help as greeters, refreshment providers, reception helpers, survey completers and outdoor clean-up workers, etc.


