



Mission Committee tries to have a local project one year and an international project the next year.

Heifer International is celebrating 75 years of working with communities to increase income, improve nutrition, care for the earth, and end world hunger and poverty. Heifer works to empower families by training people in sustainable farming, gain access to market, and empowering women.

Heifer is in 25 countries and has provided more than

32 million families with the tools and training to help them out of poverty. There are so many projects that they are involved in but this year we are concentrating on livestock and how the people that receive the animals are asked to pass on the first female offspring to another in need. This has blossomed in the US where we have developed an incubator program in which each new farmer agrees to mentor the next generation of farmers. Remember that we will be supporting Heifer International for the next year in our Sunday School offering.

I want to thank all of my church friends who helped me with a very large project at my house. Whether you were knocking down, picking up, carrying away, or the very popular ones that provided food and drinks- I am grateful for you all!
