From the Pastor...

Friends,


What are you thankful for? As we enter November, with Thanksgiving hovering at the end of the month, it's a good opportunity to think about and practice our gratitude for what we have been given. With the state of the world right now, maybe you're finding that a difficult task. Nine months ago Covid began to truly impact us here in Washington. Since then, there have been natural disasters near and far, economic challenges, illness and deaths, and political wrangling as the election approaches, along with other personal challenges. How can we be thankful?


I've preached several times about how this time in our history reminds me of the exile of the Jewish people in the Old Testament. They had been taken from normalcy, from everything they had known, and relocated to Babylon to live totally different lives. In some ways, this is what the last nine months has felt like to me. We have made changes and had changes made for us that have moved us from life as usual, pre-Covid, to life as it is now. Like the Jewish exiles, sometimes I wonder how can we sing the Lord's song in a strange land? How can we think of gratitude and joy when so much is different and unknown? Thankfully, the tales of the exiles also provide us with direction. The prophet Jeremiah brought the exiles a word from God, a word, a message, that rings true for us today as well.

'Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon: Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat what they produce. Take wives and have sons and daughters; take wives for your sons, and give your daughters in marriage, that they may bear sons and daughters; multiply there, and do not decrease. But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare.'

These are strong words of hope. The place where we are, like the exiles, is very different from the place we were. But where we are, God is also, and God challenges us while we are in this place to live, fully and joyfully. To live with gratitude for what we have, not with longing for what might have been. I pray that you are able to continue in hope, trusting the God who goes before us, and surrounds us with abundant love.


