


Oh little angel, shining light, you've set my soul to dreaming You've given back my joy in life, you've filled me with new meaning

Meals on Wheels Happened in November!

Do you have a real belief that homebound folks in Washington should be able to receive a hot and healthy meal every day? —and also have human contact with at least one person each day? Our church once again has helped be a part of



the Meals on Wheels ministry in Washington that reaches out to serve as Jesus taught us to! This past month our Board of Deacons were responsible in seeing that those deliveries were made. Terry Mangold is our deacon coordinator who organized drivers for each week. Those who volunteered to deliver were Nic and Sue Reed, Sara and Larry Barlett, Terry and Julie Mangold, and Sandy and Doug Dunlap.

The YMCA coordinates the list of individuals who have requested meals, the local hospital prepares the meals, and nine local churches alternate in the delivery of the meals to the individual homes. At this time, about 20 meals are being delivered daily. This is an increase from around 10-12 daily in pre-COVID days. Our church usually delivers for 4-5 weeks in the spring and for a month in the fall. Due to COVID, the Y took over the delivery responsibility in the spring. We lift up our thanks to the Reed's, the Barlett's, the Mangold's, and the Dunlap's for serving our Lord in this way!
