


From the Pastor...

Friends,

As I sit in my office writing this article, a blue boom lift passes by on the street outside. They have been working on the upper facade of the Federation Bank, roughly six stories in the air, and the lift carries supplies from the staging site (located to the southeast of the church) to the workers high in the scaffolding at the work site (one block northwest of the church). Each day the lift goes by multiple times, carrying the bricks and mortar that the workers will need to finish their work. As it comes and goes, I am reminded that, like the bank building, our faith lives are under construction. Buildings need constant care and maintenance, just as our faith lives do. Sometimes our faith is only under minor construction - like a building that needs the gutters cleaned and the A/C and heating units regularly checked. In these times, repairs are typically easy, minor things. In a building we might change the filters and have a professional drop by to look over the heating and cooling units. In our faith life we might regularly read the Bible, attend worship, and spend time in prayer. Sometimes buildings (and our faith) need bigger maintenance. At Federation Bank there is scaffolding which took many days to put up, and there are many workers involved with doing the work. When our faith needs major work, we are wise to look to help from others - fellow believers, our pastor, and religious writers. Like a major building repair, it could be done alone, but it is a lot easier with more people involved. As the book of Ecclesiastes reminds us, 'Two can accomplish more than twice as much as one, for the results can be much better. If one falls, the other pulls him up; but if a man falls when he is alone, he's in trouble. Also, on a cold night, two under the same blanket gain warmth from each other, but how can one be warm alone? And one standing alone can be attacked and defeated, but two can stand back-to-back and conquer; three is even better, for a triple-braided cord is not easily broken.

As you walk through this life, I encourage you to maintain your faith life with daily care and maintenance, and if you need a major renovation I hope you will reach out to others.


