Friends,

Adult Mission Fundraising - Carver Concessions



For several years groups of volunteers from this church have traveled to Iowa City on wrestling and basketball game days to work a concession stand and/or ice cream stand at Carver Hawkeye Arena. This fundraising began as a way to supplement adult mission trips for the "Twenties Connection". Over the years the funds have been used for adult mission trips, local mission needs, and supporting youth of this church in different ways.

We are again working Carver stands as a way to serve others while building funds to use as the group sees need. This year Aramark, the food contracting company, has increased the per person revenue significantly. We have worked 6 events so far this year because we had people willing and able, and the need for staffing stands has increased after the COVID shutdown. Please consider your interest in being a part of this fast paced mission opportunity. Each event is about 4 hours on your feet and a 6 hour time commitment, however we select events to work based on the number of volunteers, and you are only asked to work the games that fit your schedule. 

HACAP Food Box Update:

Did you know that for many years the Dillon Family has filled the Mission Committee community outreach HACAP food boxes? We're so grateful for your caring, Karen, Ron, and family!

A few updates – a year or so ago HACAP began providing us with smaller, empty boxes – about half as large as previous years' boxes. The change was made because the larger boxes, once filled with food, were too heavy for some of the individuals in need.

HACAP provides us with the flattened boxes. The boxes are created, filled with food, labeled, and placed at the east entrance. HACAP is contacted and the filled boxes, 12 at a time, are picked up and 12 flattened boxes are left. It's a seamless operation and one most definitely appreciated by the HACAP staff and the food recipients.

During a "normal" year we contribute about 480 boxes of food!

Due to smaller sized boxes, here are a few reminders and suggestions:

Cereal Boxes: 12 oz. size (not huge, oversized boxes)

Fruits and Veggies: 14-150z. cans

Protein ideas: Canned chicken, canned tuna, beans

Snacks: Pillsbury's brownie bag mix for an 8x8 pan - works great

Granola bars or other wrapped, single serving items that can be split

Pasta: No additional items needed

Just a little reminder, each box contains: 2 protein 4-6 veggies 2-3 fruit

2-3 snacks 1 cereal 2 starch

Misc. hygiene items are added as available: toothbrushes, toothpaste, soap, dental floss, shampoos (travel size OK)

Feel free to put any donated items in the grocery cart in Fellowship Hall or you may make a financial donation in the office toward this mission project.

Thank you to Son City Kids, our Youth Groups, and all adults who bring donations or contribute financially. We truly are Loving God and Loving Others as we reach out in caring to help feed those in need in our community.
