Friends,

Love is patient, love is kind... It's probably one of the most used passages of the Bible when it comes to weddings. 1 Corinthians chapter 13. The Apostle Paul wrote these words many years ago, and somewhere in the interim they became a favorite choice for people getting married. It makes sense, because the words paint a wonderful picture of what love is, and how those who love will act. It does us well to remember, however, that Paul was not writing these words to couples about to tie the knot. He was writing to a community of people trying to live into a new way of life, a new kingdom, a new creation. He was writing to us. This month, often called the month of love, I want to challenge you to read 1 Corinthians 13.4-13 each day. As you read, take a few moments to think about the words and how you might, or might not, be living them.

I'd love to hear how this experience goes for you!



If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing. Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.
