From the Pastor...


Friends,

This is a pick your own corn from the patch near our house six miles west of Washington.



Any donation amount is appreciated. Suggested donations are \$10 for 2 dozen ears, \$15 for 3 dozen ears, and \$25 for 6 dozen ears. Larger donations would give you unlimited trips to the sweet corn patch. You are welcome to spread your ears out over several trips.
