

I am long past due in giving thanks to the Session and congregation for your willingness to host the SHIIP (Senior Health Insurance Information Program) program at United Presbyterian Church. The welcome and hospitality are very much appreciated by me and our clients. During this past Open Enrollment Period I met with more than 275 individuals and couples to help them review their current coverage for Medicare or to sign up and learn about the Medicare system and offerings as they approach their 65th birthdays or leave insurance coverage from an employer or other source. Because SHIIP is a nonprofit organization, funded primarily by donations and grants, we track the savings we uncover for people we assist. Those statistics assist us in our grant applications. In just this one location, an aggregate total of over \$500,000 in savings was reported from October to December of 2024. In my mind, that's a whole lot of good news! Thanks for being an important part of bringing it to seniors in Washington and surrounding counties.
